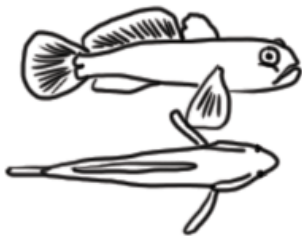


Invasive Fish Species of Ontario

Below are some images of invasive fish species of Ontario. Some facts to consider: The Round Goby are a very hungry species that reduces native populations of fish as well as competing with or just preying on several species including species that are at risk. When released into the wild, the largest Goldfish ever caught weighed 67 lbs and 4 oz! Goldfish can continue to grow and can tolerate bad environmental conditions which can create a bad situation for native populations of fish if the ecosystem isn't healthy. Sea Lampreys have been devastating on fish populations through their parasitic behaviours: 1 in 7 fish survive lamprey attacks and attacks have reduced stocks of Lake Trout, Salmon, Whitefish, Cisco and Burbot which are all Native species to Ontario lakes.
